These events- which may not have been considered when a homemade separation agreement is made, are precisely the issues that can cost a great deal in stress and money down the line. You and your spouse want to stop fighting and focus on coparenting, not start fighting all over again.

In particular, if your plan is to have your children live with your spouse, you do not want to discover the heartache that awaits when you realize that no access schedule in your agreement, means no access. A separation agreement drafted by a lawyer deals with these issues and protects you and the children.

If buying a car which doesn't work, is no deal, then a kitchen table separation agreement which later on, does not stand up in court and is not legally enforcible when the going gets rough, is no deal.
